SB 28 - Sater

Requires the Department of Social Services to apply for a global waiver for MO HealthNet (Medicaid).

Last Action: 4/5/2017 - Informal Calendar Bills for Perfection.

SB 42 - Wallingford

Enacts provisions relating to advanced practice registered nurses.

Last Action: 3/13/2017 - Hearing Conducted in Professional Registration Committee.

SB 50 - Walsh

Establishes the Advance Health Care Directive Registry.

Last Action: 3/6/2017 - Second Read in House.

SB 74 - Schaaf

Establishes a Prescription Drug Monitoring Act.

Last Action: 3/6/2017 - Second Read in House.

SB 116 - Schupp

Allows a tax credit for certain long-term care facilities for a portion of the costs of upgrading emergency generators.

Last Action: 3/7/2017 - Hearing Conducted in Economic Development Committee.

SB 139 - Sater

Creates the Rx Cares for Missouri Program.

Last Action: 3/13/2017 - Second Read in House.

SB 301 – Wallingford

Amends the provision relating to reporting of suspected sexual assault of a resident of a long-term care facility to require reporting to local law enforcement.

Last Action: 4/5/2017 - Voted Do Pass Seniors, Families and Children Committee.

SB 314 and 340 – Schatz

Establishes the Narcotics Control Act. The Department of Health and Senior Services is required to establish and maintain a program to monitor the prescribing and dispensing of all Schedule II, III, and IV controlled substances by all licensed professionals who prescribe or dispense these substances in Missouri.

SB 387 – Curls

Modifies several provisions relating to long-term care certificates of need.

Last Action: 2/9/2017 - Second Read and Referred to Health and Pensions Committee.

SB 423 – Sater

Removes the termination date on the MO Rx Prescription Drug Program.

Last Action: 3/15/2017 - Voted Do Pass Seniors, Families and Children Committee.

SB 456 – Rowden

Adds cognitive, emotional, mental, and developmental disabilities to the service program administered by the Children's Special Health Care Needs Service, including provision of habilitative and rehabilitative services, and lifespan care. Specifies when an individual is eligible to free health services, and provides that no third-party payer for health care services shall limit coverage or deny reimbursement for these services where the disability requires the individual to receive care or assistance from another person at any age.

Last Action: 4/5/2017 - Hearing Cancelled in Health and Pensions Committee.

SB 493 – Hegeman

Authorizes a health care decision-maker to make health care decisions for an incapacitated patient who does not have a person with legal authority to consent for the patient.

Last Action: 3/2/2017 - Second Read and Referred to Judiciary and Civil and Criminal Jurisprudence Committee.

SB 526 – Brown

Changes the monitoring of consumer-directed services, requires unscheduled visits and notification of the Department of Health and Senior Services if the personal care attendant was not present. Also provides that falsification of personal care attendant time sheets shall be considered fraud and requires vendors to submit an annual cost report to the Department.
